



Call for Consultancy to Conduct a Baseline Survey in Rhonda and Kaptembwa -Subject Matter Experts

Flamingo Lakes Conservation Network (FlamingoNet) is national not-for-profit conservation and development organization that believes in contributing to sustainable management of water and lakes, enhancing self reliance and resilience to Climate Change and secure a future in which humans live in harmony with nature. Using nature based approaches, we work to inspire and meet people's essential needs; to save water, protect and restore nature; and to stabilize the climate and enhance livelihoods through increasing self-reliance and resilient communities.

There is great opportunity by all people to pursue their own sustainable development and FlamingoNet is working with different groups in pursuant of the same. FlamingoNet provides services in Water, Sanitation and Hygiene, Climate Change, Biodiversity Conservation, Agriculture and Renewable Energy. The recipients of these services include local communities governmental institutions, non-governmental organizations private sector organizations, and individual households.

The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES-Kenya), the Civil Society Urban Development Platform (CSUDP), and, the Pan African Climate Justice Alliance (PACJA) has made a call for proposals for the Innovative Community Water and Solid Waste Management Grants. The project's overall objective is "To strengthen democracy and inclusive democratic processes in matters of urban quality of life, climate change, and biodiversity in Kenya". The specific objective is to achieve strengthened responsive, inclusive, participatory, and representative governance in sustainable water management and climate justice across Makueni, Kisumu, and Nakuru Counties.

Our interest is to contribute towards Objective 4 (OP4) which seeks to increase opportunities for youth and women-led civil society actors and grassroots organizations to engage in initiatives on sustainable water management in informal settlements in Nakuru City.

The SCEJU–Nakuru Informal Settlements Water Project is being implemented by Flamingo Lakes Conservation Network (FlamingoNet) with the objective of improving access to quality and reliable water supply while strengthening inclusive, participatory, and accountable water governance in selected low-income settlements of Nakuru City. The project focuses on locally led and innovative water

supply solutions, expansion of water coverage, improvement of distribution management, and enhancement of service delivery through model water vending systems and the Delegated Management Model. This baseline survey seeks to generate comprehensive social, economic, environmental, and institutional data on the current state of water access and service delivery in targeted low-income settlements of Nakuru City.

The survey is designed to establish benchmark conditions against which changes resulting from project interventions can be measured over the project period. It provides the empirical foundation required to guide implementation, stakeholder engagement, monitoring, and learning. Specifically, the baseline survey seeks to support the project's objectives by documenting existing conditions related to water coverage, availability, reliability, affordability, quality, and distribution management, including challenges associated with non-revenue water. The survey will also examine prevailing water vending practices, customer support mechanisms, and institutional arrangements for water service delivery.

The assignment is expected to be completed over a period of 41 calendar days - this period includes provision of all deliverables and travel time. The assignment should start on 9th **January 2026** and be completed no later than **14th January 2026**
